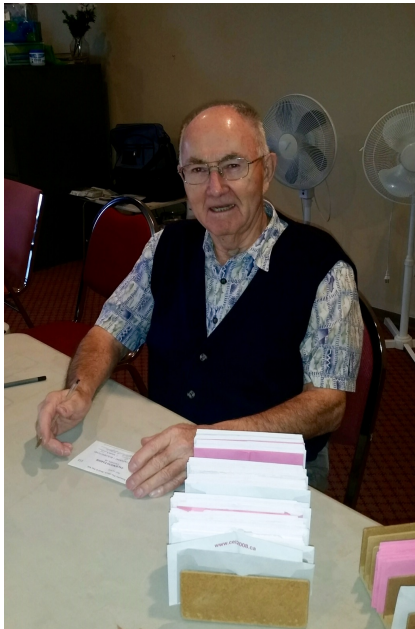

 **Field Agent Report**

It is that time of year again: TFSA and RRSP "peak season"

The Knights of Columbus have TFSA, RRSP and unregistered savings contracts available to you. Our current interest rates on new TFSA, RRSP and unregistered "flexible premium annuity" contracts and additional deposits to existing contracts are better than most currently available 5 year GIC's. For existing contract holders, remember that the minimum interest rate of your contract may be higher than current rates being paid and the higher rate is payable not only on your prior contributions but on all subsequent permitted contributions. KofC TFSA, RRSP and unregistered savings contracts are considered a very safe investment and are more flexible than GIC's.

We also have RRSP-registered cash value life insurance and are perhaps the only company in Canada with such a product currently available. Existing KofC term life insurance contracts can be converted without further medical qualification to RRSP-registered cash value life insurance.

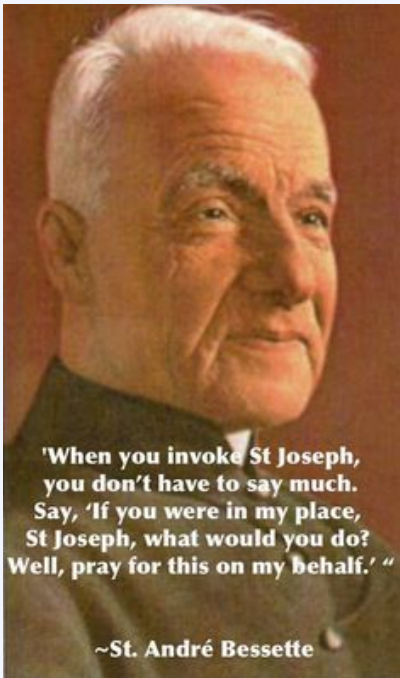

The current cash value of existing RRSP funds at other institutions can also be transferred into an RRSP-registered life insurance contract, creating a much higher RRSP roll-over or estate or other beneficiary payment than the value of the current RRSP, in the unexpected early death of an RRSP contract holder.

The deadline for 2015 tax year RRSP contributions is **Monday, 29 February 2016**. RRSP contributions in January and February of 2016 can be used for either the 2015 or the 2016 taxation year. Start early - make monthly contributions from your bank account or contribute regularly throughout the year rather than waiting to the end of the contribution period to find funds to deposit into you RRSP.

Regarding TFSA's, under proposed legislation, starting January 1, 2016, the annual TFSA dollar limit for 2016 will decrease from \$10,000 to \$5,500. The TFSA annual room limit will be indexed to inflation and rounded to the nearest \$500. Cumulative contribution room from eligible current and previous years is adjusted downward by deposits made in the current year, but withdrawals in the current year do not increase contribution room, that room being recovered only in the following year. If you are uncertain of your current contribution room, I recommend you call CRA to receive a TFSA Room Statement.

A FRIEND. A BROTHER. A SAINT.

Brother André, born Alfred Bessette, surely is one of the most popular Québécois of the 20th century. Even before he was canonized in 2010, his reputation for holiness crossed frontiers and influenced generations of people.

At first assigned to be doorkeeper at Collège Notre-Dame, he was then named caretaker at that house of prayer which he shepherded into existence on Mount Royal. The religious brother welcomed thousands of distressed people or those who were looking for a ray of hope. He listened to them and recommended that they pray to Saint Joseph in whom he had full confidence. Any number of miraculous healings took place there and hearts turned toward God. 1845

AUGUST 09, 1845

Birth of Alfred Bessette on Grand-Bois Lane in Saint-Grégoire d'Iberville, son of Isaac Bessette and Clothilde Foisy. The very next day, he is baptised in the "chapel/rectory" of Saint-Grégoire Parish by Father Pierre-Albert Sylvestre.



1857

Alfred, aged 12, moves to Saint-Césaire and receives the Sacrament of Confirmation by Bishop Prince, Bishop of Saint-Hyacinthe. A photo of Alfred is taken for the occasion. Alfred works on a farm, and tries his hand (without much success) at the trades of



1863

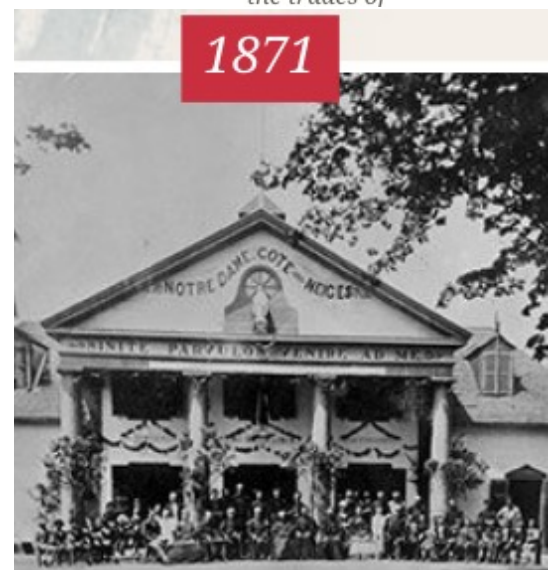
Alfred emigrates to the United States and works in textile mills in Connecticut and possibly in Massachusetts and in Rhode Island.



1870

DECEMBER 27, 1870

Alfred becomes a postulant of the Congregation of Holy Cross in Montreal. On December 27, he enters the novitiate; from then on he is known as Brother André, CSC, in memory of Father André Provençal.



1871

DECEMBER 20, 1871

He is given the obedience of "doorkeeper, infirmarian, and lamp tender" at Collège Notre-Dame. His duties also include running errands, caring for the garden, cutting students' hair, managing the laundry and working as general factotum.

1878

Publication in a French magazine of anecdotal cures by a Brother André using oil taken from a lamp.



1872



AUGUST 22, 1872

He makes first vows.

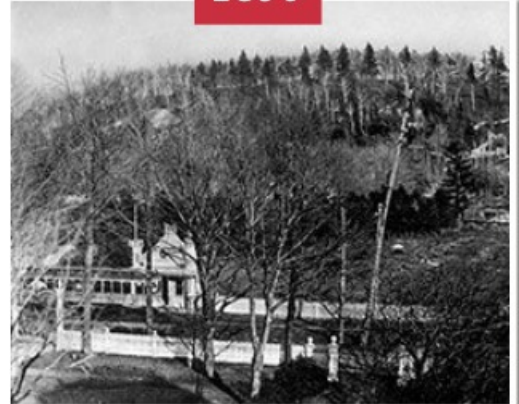
1874



FEBRUARY 02, 1874

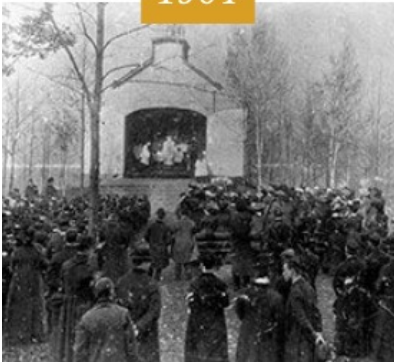
Brother André pronounces his final vows at the age of 28 and a half years.

1896



Purchase by the Congregation of Holy Cross of the mountain property across the street from the Collège. Brother André dreams of putting up a wayside chapel there, dedicated to Saint Joseph.

1904



OCTOBER 19, 1904

Blessing of a modest chapel: Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal is founded.

1909



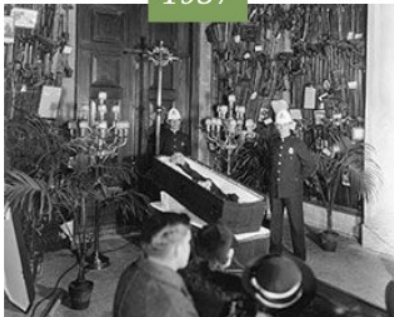
From 1909 to 1936, he greets thousands at his Oratory office, who come seeking hope, reassurance, or even healing.

Assigned as full-time caretaker of Saint Joseph's Oratory, Brother André leaves the Collège after almost 40 years of service.

1937



JANUARY 06, 1937

Death of Brother André at 91 years of age, at the hospital in Saint-Laurent. A million persons file past Brother André's coffin from January 6 to 12.
