

# SACRAMENTS

"Let us keep the flame of faith alive through prayer and the Sacraments; let us ensure we do not forget God." -Pope Francis

Welcome to Ascension Catholic Parish Sacraments. Our Sacrament Programs for Reconciliation, Holy Communion, and Confirmation run through the school calendar year. The Diocese of Calgary requires students in Grade 2 or higher to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Holy Communion, and for students to be in Grade 6 or higher for Confirmation. Our programs are closed for the school year 2023–2024 and will open for registration for the school year 2024–2025 on **June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024**. Please mark your calendars to check our <u>website</u> to register.

**Infant Baptism (Infants 0–5 years):** Parents are asked to contact the Church to register their child for Baptism. Along with the registration, there is required paperwork to be submitted and a Baptism Preparation Class. The classes take place once a month on a Saturday morning. To register or for further information, email <u>baptism@ascensionparish.ca</u>.

School-Age Baptism (children 6 and older): This is a unique program offered for families of school-age children. We offer the program twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall. Families take part in two classes and submit the required paperwork. Our class for spring 2024 is accepting registrations; please contact <u>baptism@ascensionparish.ca</u> to register or for more information.

Adult Confirmation (adults 18 and over who have been Baptized): We offer Adult Confirmation Classes for adults who are missing one or more of their Sacraments. The class is offered once a year and aligns with the Confirmation Mass during the Easter Season. For more information, contact <u>sacraments@ascensionparish.ca</u>.

**RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults):** For adults seeking Baptism and conversion into the Catholic faith, please contact the Parish office for more information at <u>admin@ascensionparish.ca</u>.

**Marriage:** By appointment, 6 months in advance. Please contact the Parish office at <u>admin@ascensionparish.ca</u>.

**Marriage Preparation:** Please contact the Parish office for more information at admin@ascensionparish.ca or through the Diocese at <u>https://www.catholicyyc.ca/marriageprep.html</u>.

# FACTS OF FAITH

#### Candles, Candles, Candles

Lighting candles symbolizes Christ as the light of the world. Jesus referred to Himself as the light of the world, and St. John's Gospel connects Christ with the imagery of light in John 1:4: 'In Him was life, and the life was the light of men.' Our candles are required to be made of 51% beeswax for its purity, and when lit, the fragrance fills the air with Christ's grace.


**The Paschal Candle or Christ's Candle**, is lit at the Vigil Mass and remains lit throughout the 50 days of Easter. It is then moved to the baptismal font on Pentecost Sunday. The Paschal Candle bears symbols representing Christ, including the Cross, Alpha and Omega, signifying Christ's presence from the beginning of time to the end of time, the current year, and five grains of incense for the wounds of Christ.

Altar Candles on the Altar signify the light of Christ and the reverence of the Mass. Two candles are lit for the lower Mass or our lower feast day, four candles for a solemn Mass, and six candles for a high Mass.

**The Sanctuary Candle**: A red candle beside the Tabernacle, reminds us of the true presence of Christ with us.

**Baptism Candle**: Families receive the baptism candle as a reminder to keep the light of Christ in the child who has been baptized.

**Votive Candles** are for the faithful, for prayers to be sent up to the Lord.



# Baby Jesus is Presented in the Temple

On February second we celebrate the feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. That is the day that Saint Joseph and Our Lady took the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to consecrate Him to God. The Jews were supposed to dedicate their first-born sons to God, so Mary and Joseph were obedient to the law even though their Baby was God Himself!


