

CORPUS CHRISTI - MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dear friends,

Today we have yet another special day, the Solemnity of "Corpus Christi", the Body and Blood of Christ. What a beautiful day to receive 1st Holy Communion! Our Masses this month have been blessed with the joy of the boys and girls who received Jesus for the first time. Let's continue to pray for them!

It was good to speak about our belief in the *real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist* during the Easter Season. It is a call to love Jesus ever more deeply.

In many parts of the world, there are large processions honouring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. I remember participating, during my time in Europe, in the Eucharistic procession with St Pope John Paul II in Rome; in the historical processions of Orvieto and Bolsena, also in Italy; and an equally impressive procession through the streets of Cologne, Germany. You may wish to look them up on the computer and take a peek. It lifts one's spirits! Why do we have processions in honour of our Lord? It is one way of bearing public witness to our belief, not only that Jesus is truly present in the Host, but also that he is worth praising and extolling, because he is our God and Lord. And so, this weekend we will have a Eucharistic procession at 2pm. It will begin with some adoration in the Church, after which we will accompany the Lord with song as we process around our Church property. You are most welcome!

Also this weekend, we will be completing the diocesan Renewal survey together. Please, I heartily ask that you join us, taking 10-15 minutes together after Mass, to fill out the survey on your cellphone. In the end, it is so that Bishop McGrattan and that we, at Ascension Catholic Parish, might know you better, to serve you better. On the little card in the pews you will find the QR code with the image of Christ, the Good Shepherd. Why was this image chosen? "I know my sheep," says the Lord.

He knows us. On this Sunday, the Solemnity of his Body and Blood, we rejoice that he remains so close to us, so that we, too, might know him ever more intimately. Blessings-

FACTS OF FAITH

Corpus Christi

St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon (1193-1258) was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist. After years of petitioning Pope Urban IV, he instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church in 1264. The original office of this feast day was written largely by St. Thomas Aquinas and is considered one of the most beautiful of the Roman Breviary (a liturgical book that contains the daily service for the divine office, the official prayer of the Roman Catholic Church)

Eucharistic Prayer

This weekend we celebrate Corpus Christi (Body of Christ) in honour of the real presence of the body of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. During the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we hear the Eucharist Prayer, which is a prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification and the center of the eucharistic celebration. It contains: the preface, expressing thanksgiving in the name of the entire people of God; the acclamation or sanctus (holy, holy, holy), which is recited by the Priest and people or sung; the eucharistic prayer; the invocations for the Church, the epiclesis (the liturgical invocation of the Holy Spirit); narration of the institution and consecration of the bread and wine in the words of Christ; the fulfillment of the command given by Christ to the Church to carry on this mystery of the sacrifice, called the anamnesis; the offering of the victim to God the Father in the Holy Spirit; the intersessions for the living and the dead and for the faithful present; the final doxology and concluding Amen.

The Diocese of Calgary requests that students receive their First Reconciliation prior to their First Holy Communion. We offer both Sacraments together in the school calendar year. Open for students who are in Grade Two or higher.

Confirmation and Sacraments for Teens

<u>Confirmation</u> is open for students who are in Grade Six or higher.

<u>Sacraments for Teens</u> is open for students who are in Grade Seven or higher.


<u>School Age Baptism</u> is a program that our Parish is offering for students who are attending our Catholic Schools and have not been Baptized.

Sacrament Requirements

Students who are preparing for Reconciliation, Communion and/or Confirmation are to be Baptized and are required to submit a Baptism certificate with their registration.

The Body and Blood of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the Holy

Eucharist.

At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into

Heaven.
Jesus comes to us in every Mass.

The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.


How do I receive Communion well?

- 1. Be ready! Think about what is going to happen. Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul. If you do, then go to confession first.
- 2. Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion. This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.
- 3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!
